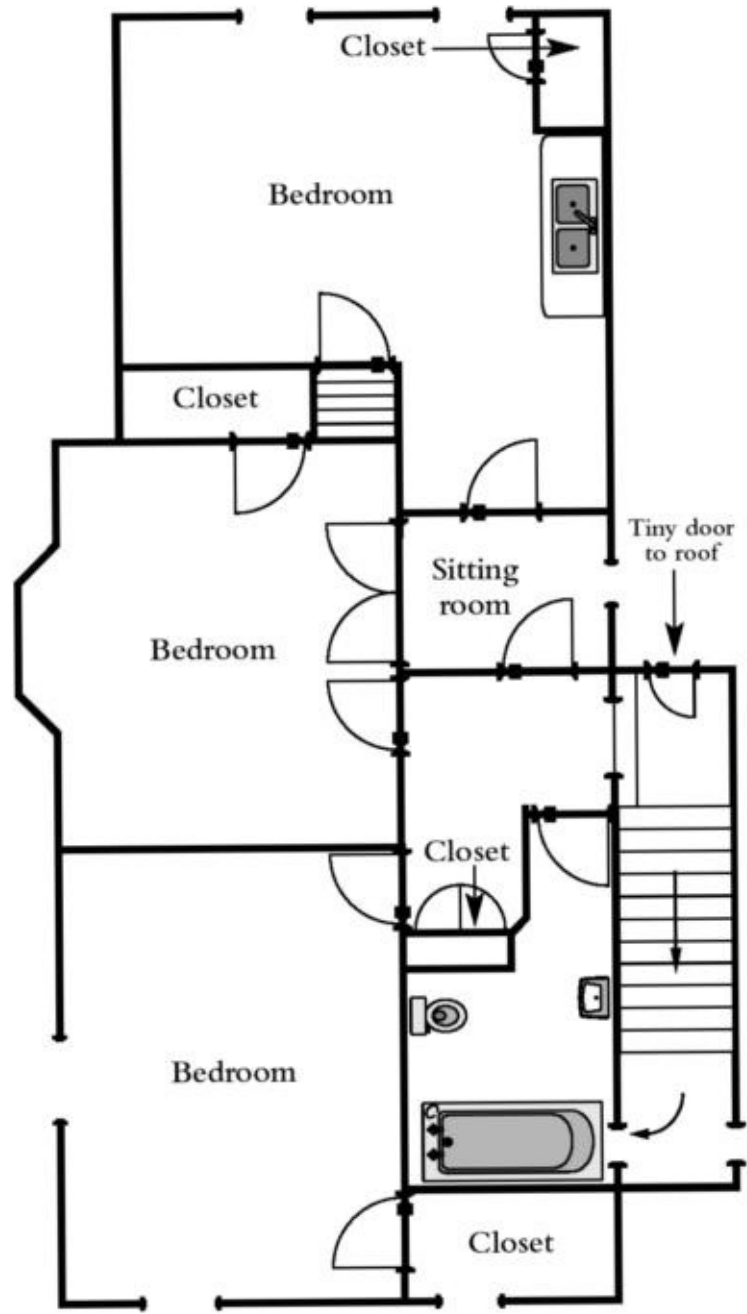
Original main floor
